Recall examples

20 September 2021 – smoothie drops

The recall was due to the potential presence of foreign matter (plastic). Food products containing rubber fragments may cause injury if consumed.


6 October 2021 – sparkling apple juice

The recall was due to a packaging fault. The products have potential for glass breakage. Food products containing glass may cause injury if consumed.

10 August 2021 - dates

This recall was due to potential microbial (Hepatitis A) contamination. Food products containing Hepatitis A may cause illness if consumed.



Allergens - July to December 2021

Recall examples

26 November 2021 – Persian labneh


The presence of an undeclared allergen (milk, sesame and soy). Any consumers who have a milk, sesame and soy allergy or intolerance may have a reaction if the product is consumed.

26 November 2021 – biscuits

The presence of an undeclared allergen (milk). Any consumers who have a milk allergy or intolerance may have a reaction if the product is consumed.

24 December 2021 – ice cream


The presence of an undeclared allergen (peanut). Any consumers who have a peanut allergy or intolerance may have a reaction if the product is consumed.




ALLERGENS – JULY TO DECEMBER 2021 REASONS FOR RECALLS

Microbiological contamination - July to December 2021

Recall examples

3 September 2021 – apple juice

The recall was due to a microbial (mycotoxin patulin) contamination. Food products contaminated with mycotoxin patulin may cause illness if consumed.


14 September 2021 – smoked ham

The recall was due to a microbial (Listeria monocytogenes) contamination. Food products contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes may cause illness if consumed.


29 November 2021 – pates

The recall was due to a microbial (Listeria monocytogenes) contamination. Food products contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes may cause illness if consumed.

BABIES AND KIDS – JULY TO DECEMBER 2021 REASONS FOR RECALLS

Recall examples

15 September 2021 – kids chair


The three screws used to attach the legs to the base of the chair may be too short, and if a child rocks on it, leans on it at an angle, or climbs on it, the chair may break. If the chair breaks while in use, this could cause an injury.

25 November 2021 – magnetic balls

If a child swallows more than one small high powered magnet, the magnets can stick together across the walls of the child's intestine or other digestive tissue, which can lead to internal injuries and even death. The magnets may pose a choking hazard to young children (small parts).

17 December 2021 – baby bell rattle


The rattle may break, releasing small parts. Small parts may pose a choking or suffocation hazard for young children, which can lead to severe injury or death.




BABIES AND KIDS – JULY TO DECEMBER 2021 CATEGORIES OF RECALLS

HOME AND LIVING – JULY TO DECEMBER 2021 REASONS FOR RECALLS

Recall examples

5 July 2021 - mugs, bowls & plates

The product may break during use. If the product breaks when it is filled with hot liquid, this can increase the risk of burns, scalding or serious injury.

17 September 2021 – phone AC adaptor


The adaptor's insulated pin may crack and expose the active pin. Risk of electric shock or electrocution causing injury or death.

19 October 2021 – LED light

The button battery compartment of the product may not be adequately secured, so the button battery in the product may be easily accessible. If young children gain access to the button battery and ingest it, they may suffer internal burn injuries, which can result in serious illness and even death.



Recall examples

3 September 2021 – wound dressing

The packaging of the adhesive wound dressings is not sealed together completely, leaving partial or fully open seals. The product may become non-sterile if the seal is open. If the dressing is non-sterile and used to treat wounds, this may result in infection and health complications.

3 November 2021 – bicycle

The front pulley's clamping bolts may not be tightened properly and may allow the steering wire to slip. If the steering wire slips, the rider will lose steering control. This may lead to an accident causing injury or death.


30 November 2021 – shampoo

The shampoo may be contaminated with Enterobacter gergoviae. Cosmetic products contaminated with Enterobacter gergoviae may cause significant infection or illness, especially if the user is immunocompromised.
